The mandolin is a very old instrument of the lute family and has a distinct tone color of its own -- shimmering, delicate and unique. Composers such as Beethoven, Vivaldi, Mozart and Verdi have written for it.

This instrument, however, did not come into its own until the latter part of the 19th century when the luthiers Pasquale Vinaccia in Italy and Orville Gibson in the United States perfected its construction and mandolinists, such as Raffaele Calace and Carlo Munier in Italy and Giuseppe Pettine and William Place in the United States (Providence, R. I.) perfected it technically and artistically.

The mandolin orchestra consists of mandolin, mandola, mando-cello, mando-bass and guitar and is capable of producing music of a very high artistic standard. Other instruments, such as the banjo for fortissimo, woodwinds and percussion, may be added to the orchestra for color variation.

The Providence Mandolin Orchestra has been organized for only a short time and the majority of its members are from the Providence School of Guitar and Mandolin and the Perry Music Studio. It is our hope that this orchestra will become a permanent and important part of the cultural life of our community.
