Upcoming Mandolin Orchestra Events



The Providence Mandolin Orchestra was founded by the late Hibbard Perry in 1973. This group carries on an American musical tradition which goes back to the 1880's when a group of Spanish bandurria players toured the U.S. under the name of "The Spanish Students," and began a craze for mandolin and guitar groups that rivaled the popularity of rock and roll today. Mr. Davis has been associated with the Providence

Mandolin Orchestra since its inception, and in 1989 became the full-time music director. In 1999

the Orchestra was featured at the Zweite Bayerische Bezirksmusikfest in Munich, Germany and at the 5th International Mandolin Festival in Strasbourg, France.
