Notes to PMO program by Robert Margo: Austrian composer Hans Gal's "Capriccio" is one of the most important modern works for mandolin orchestra. "Reverie" is a beloved Italian piece from the romantic "Golden Age" of the mandolin in the early twentieth century. Joel Hobb's remarkable three-movement work was commissioned by the Classical Mandolin Society of

America for its 2015 convention in Austin TX. Stanley Myer's "Cavatina" is better known as the theme music from the 1970s movie, "The Deer Hunter". The PMO closes tonight's program with two favorites by its long-time resident (now retired) composer, Owen Hartford – the aptly titled "Family Squabble" and the evocative "Latin Sketches" with soaring melodies, shifting rhythms, and striking harmonic modulations.

The **Al Fresco Quartet** is Christine Chito (mandolin), Mark Chuoke (mandolin), Don Hague (mandola in G), and Dan Moore (mandocello).

The original **Providence Mandolin Orchestra** was founded in 1911 by William Place Jr, one of the great virtuosos of the "Golden Age" of the mandolin in the early twentieth Century. The modern version of the PMO dates from the early 1970s, when it was revived by Hibbard Perry, a student of Place's. Since then the PMO has become one of the leading American mandolin ensembles with regular performances throughout the eastern United States and Western Europe. PMO Music Director **Mark Davis** began his guitar and mandolin studies with Hibbard Perry and continued with Siegfried Behrend from whom he inherited his fascination with contemporary forms of musical expression.
