Program notes: We begin with Konrad Wölki's "Suite Nr 1," an early (1930s) work in a neo-baroque style. Two striking recent pieces by prominent international composers -- "Darkness and Light" by Werner Ruecker (Australia) and "Persephone" (Holland) by Bart Verstraeten -- receive American premieres this evening. Amadei's "Suite Marinaresca" is a classic of romantic Italian mandolin during the instrument's "Golden Age" of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, as is Manente's "Reverie de Poete". "Verano Poreño" is one of four Piazzolla's tangos that comprise his epic "seasons" of Buenos Aires. We end with Sébastien Paci's beautiful, profoundly Spanish, "Suite Campesina".

In recent years, the PMO has given US or world premieres of works by Richard Charlton, Owen Hartford, Annette Kruisbrink, Stephen Lalor, Michael Nix, Werner Ruecker, Emile Stöpler, Bart Verstraeten, and Frank Wallace, among others. Mark Davis, who pursues an active career as a performer on guitar, mandolin, teacher, and conductor, is the PMO's music director.
