Program Notes (by Robert Margo). Our concert begins with one of the classics of the modern German literature for “zupforchester”, Konrad Wölki’s *Tafelmusik*, with PMO member Michael J. Raymond, Jr. as recorder soloist. A late work, Raffaele Calace’s very beautiful (and harmonically complex) *Intermezzo* features extensive use of tremolo, the mandolin’s signature technique. Brazilian-born Laurindo Almeida was a leading classical guitarist in the United States after WW2, well-known for his early championing of the guitar music of Barrios, Villa-Lobos, and other Latin American composers. This is the first performance of PMO member Mark Armstrong’s innovative new arrangement for mandolin orchestra of the “Moderato” movement from Almeida’s first guitar concerto. One of the today’s leading composers for plucked strings, James Kellaris’ latest work for mandolin orchestra, *Au Café Cardamome* (which the PMO premiered in March 2022) features extended techniques and extensive use of Greek melodies, rhythms, and harmonies. Francine Trester’s (Berklee School of Music) remarkable *Three Movements for Mandolin Orchestra* was commissioned for the PMO in 2006 by Robert Margo. Our program closes with a new work, *Open the Door to the North Wind*, by the distinguished classical guitarist Ron Pearl, written for the PMO in 2022.

The modern **Providence Mandolin Orchestra** dates from the early 1970s, when it was revived by Hibbard Perry. Since then, the PMO has become one of the leading American mandolin ensembles with regular performances throughout the eastern United States and Western Europe. The PMO’s music director since 1989, **Mark Davis** began his guitar and mandolin studies with Hibbard Perry in Rhode Island and continued his musical training with the eminent German guitarist Siegfried Behrend. Davis has performed widely in the United States and abroad and has made numerous recordings.
