The Al Fresco Quartet is Christine Chito, first mandolin; Mark Chuoke, second mandolin; John Rufo, mandola in G; and Oliver Reid, mandocello.

Notes (by Robert Margo): The Providence Mandolin Orchestra (PMO) is delighted to perform for the first time at the Parish Center for the Arts. Our program begins with a PMO classic – "Grooves #1" by PMO composer emeritus Owen Hartford, followed by two classics of the European repertoire, "Abendmusic" by the German composer Kurt Schwaen, and "Music for Play" by the Italian composer Claudio Mandonico. After a

brief intermission, the second half of the program features a performance of a Bach Fugue (by the Orchestra's resident Al Fresco Quartet); "Eclipse," a three-movement concerto for mandola in G (octave mandolin) and mandolin orchestra by the Australian composer Michelle Nelson; and "Pursuit" by Philadelphia-area composer Thomas Smith.

The original **Providence Mandolin Orchestra** was founded in 1911 by William Place Jr, one of the leading mandolinists in early twentieth century America. The modern PMO dates from the early 1970s, when it was revived by Hibbard Perry, a former student of Place, Jr. Since then, the PMO has become the leading American mandolin ensemble with regular performances throughout the eastern United States and multiple tours to Europe. The PMO is dedicated to the performance of original contemporary music, including many pieces written for the ensemble. **Mark Davis**, who pursues an active career as a conductor and performer on guitar and mandolin, has served as the PMO's music director since 1989.

Daniel K. Moore played mandocello with the PMO for nearly twenty years beginning in 1996. As a music educator and conductor, Dan's other passion has been English handbells (he has served local and national handbell organizations in a variety of capacities) and although recently retired, he has continued to be active as a clinician and mentor to handbell choirs throughout New England.
